Re: Fishing Policy

Dear Residents,

School's out for the summer! Our community is so blessed to have a small number of fishing lakes inside of our community. It is a wonderful way for our younger residents to get out in the fresh air and away from their electronics. They do need to remember we also have abundant wildlife and should assume there are alligators in every body of water in River Wilderness.

However, not all lakes are designated as fishing lakes. I am enclosing a link to our fishing policy on our website. At the end of the policy is a map showing all of our lakes and arrows designating which lakes are fishing lakes. Another great option is to try fishing off of our boat dock.

Here is a listing of the lakes in which fishing is permitted: Lakes 13, 18, 19, 24, 25, 41, 43, 44, and 45. It might be fun for our youth to print off the map and explore to find all of these lakes! However, fishing in lakes other than those listed may be considered trespassing.

Remember, regardless of the authorized lake in which you fish, we are a catch and release community. Also be respectful of our resident's personal property, and do not cross private property as you access the lakes.
