In accordance with the Covenants 3.08 and Florida Statutes 720.3, the Board defines the flag policies.

WHAT TO FLY?

- American flag. If several flags are flown on one pole at the same time, the American flag is always on top.
- State of Florida flag.
- Flags representing the United States Armed Forces.
- Special occasion flags.

WHERE TO FLY THEM?

- From flag poles erected according to specifications and in locations approved by the Architectural Review Committee.
- From brackets attached to the outside footprint wall of your home.
- **NOT** attached to mailboxes, mail box posts or erected within 10 feet of mail delivery space.
- **NOT** hanging inside any home window.

WHEN TO FLY?

- Fly 24/7 – American flag, State of Florida flag. After sunset, The American Flag must be lighted.
- U.S. Armed Forces flag on Armed Forces Day, Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day & Veteran's Day.
- Fly 1 to 4 days – College/University, sports teams, special occasion.
- Fly up to 14 days – holiday, seasonal.

BANNERS

Small banners are to be displayed near the residence.

Display up to 14 days for holiday banners, one month for seasonal and decorative banners.

No banners are to be attached to the mailbox or mailbox post except holiday garland bunting.
